Every year we enter Advent as a season of expectation and promise. We spend four weeks waiting and watching, with wonder building as we hear of God's expected transformation of the world.

Through this Advent and Christmas season, we are invited into a time of great expectation. We are invited to wrestle with our own expectations of God and God's expectations for us. Where is God calling us to be willingly watchful? Where is God delighting us with unexpected peace? Where is God filling us with unexpected abundance? Where is God meeting us with the divine in our midst?

Welcome! If you came as a guest today, we hope you leave as a friend. May this worship service surround you with the love of God through Christ and fill you with the Holy Spirit.

WELCOME

The assembly is invited to stand as worship begins.

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

All may make the sign of the cross, the sign that is marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.

P: Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel, who alone does wondrous things.

C: Blessed be God's name forever. Amen.

P: Beloved, now is the time to wake from sleep. Let us confront our sins, and confess them to the one who is merciful and just.

Silence is kept for reflection.

P: God of great expectations,

C: We confess that we have been closed off to your reign of justice.

We have strayed from your paths.

We expect war instead of peace.

We lower our expectations for life,

dishonoring one another and your creation.

Purify us with your refining fire

and set us again on your expectant way of love,

that we may bear fruit worthy of repentance,

and welcome your coming among us. Amen.

P: People of God, expect the unexpected.

God gives us living signs:

New things are growing in our midst and tender branches spring forth.

This is our life expectancy.

By water and the Spirit we are joined to this wonder.

C: to bring restoration and not vengeance


L: To dream of a world free from guilt and shame

FIRST READING - Isaiah 7:10-16

When threatened, King Ahaz decided to secure his throne and kingdom by seeking Assyrian help. Isaiah reminds Ahaz that human attempts to establish security will fail. The prophet gives the sign that is the only source of true safety: Immanuel, God is with us!

The Lord spoke to Ahaz, saying, ¹¹Ask a sign of the Lord your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven. ¹²But Ahaz said, I will not ask, and I will not put the Lord to the test. ¹³Then Isaiah said: "Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary mortals, that you weary my God also? ¹⁴Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son, and shall name him Immanuel. ¹⁵He shall eat curds and honey by the time he knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good. ¹⁶For before the child knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good, the land before whose two kings you are in dread will be deserted."

L: The Word of God still speaks.

C: Thanks be to God.

CHOIR ANTHEM

PSALM - Psalm 80:1-7, 17-19

The psalm is read responsively.

L: Hear, O Shepherd of Israel, leading Joseph like a flock; shine forth, you that are enthroned upon the cherubim.

let your face shine upon us, and we shall be saved.

let your face shine upon us, and we shall be saved.

SECOND READING - Romans 1:1-7

Most of the Christians in Rome do not know Paul, so he introduces himself as an apostle divinely appointed to spread God's gospel. Its content is the promised coming of Christ, and Paul's mission is to bring about the obedience of faith among all nations, including his Roman audience.


Paul, a servant of Jesus Christ, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, ²which he promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy scriptures, ³the gospel concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh ⁴and was declared to be Son of God with power according to the spirit of holiness by resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord, ⁵through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith among all the Gentiles for the sake of his name, ⁶including yourselves who are called to belong to Jesus Christ, ⁷To all God's beloved in Rome, who are called to be saints: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

L: The Word of God still speaks.

C: Thanks be to God.

The assembly stands to welcome the gospel.

GOSPEL READING - Matthew 1:18-25

Matthew's story of Jesus' birth focuses on the role of Joseph, who adopts the divinely-begotten child into the family of David and obediently gives him the name Jesus, which means "God saves."

Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. ²⁰But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."

²²All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: ²³"Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us." ²⁴When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife, ²⁵but had no marital relations with her until she had borne a son; and he named him Jesus.

P: The Gospel of the Lord.

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

C: We believe in God, who in greatness created with a Word all that is and continues to be.

We believe in God,

who is Word made flesh, Emmanuel, born of Mary, come to fulfill the expected promise: justice, mercy, peace, love; who was executed because our expectations were worldly, not divine; who rose to break the expectation that death has the final word.

We believe in God

who fills us with expectations; who pushes us to change; who moves us with her joy and gladness that we might be united to proclaim the Word full of grace and truth for an expectant people.

PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

The prayers reflect the wideness of God's mercy: for the church; for the well-being of creation; for peace & justice; for the poor, oppressed, suffering, & sick; for the congregation & other concerns.

Anticipating the coming of God's redeeming love, let us pray for a world in longing expectation. *A brief silence*.

God our shepherd, let your Spirit move with power throughout the church. Give discernment and wisdom to our bishops, pastors, deacons, and lay leaders. Take away our fear, so that we serve and love, confident that you are guiding us. In great anticipation, **hear our prayer**.

God our source, awaken us to the beauty of the earth and the marvelous variety of life. Unite humankind in repairing and caring for your creation. Protect creatures and habitats in peril due to rising seas and warming temperatures. In great anticipation, **hear our prayer.**

God our vision, raise up leaders in every nation who dream of freedom and justice for all people. We pray for the work of international organizations that promote peace and human rights (*organizations may be named*). In great anticipation, **hear our prayer.**

God our helper, come to the aid of all who cry out to you. Shelter migrants, refugees, and those fleeing war and famine. Bring relief to individuals and families experiencing hunger, homelessness, or impoverishment. Comfort any who are isolated or lonely. In great anticipation, **hear our prayer**.

God our Emmanuel, you are with us in our life together. We give you thanks for gathering us in worship and fellowship, and we remember those who cannot be present. Watch over those who travel. Heal the sick and speed their recovery (*especially*). In great anticipation, **hear our prayer.**

Here other intercessions may be offered.

God our hope, you bring life out of death, and you promise to be our God forever. Shine upon the faithful who now rest in the fulfillment of your promise and bring us also into your blessed reign of peace. In great anticipation, **hear our prayer.**

Trusting that God hears us and knows our deepest longings, we offer our prayers with great expectation. **Amen.**

OFFERING PRAYER


We continue to be the church together through prayer and financial support. Tithes and offerings can be dropped off in the narthex, mailed, sent through the bank or our online giving platform.

C: Amen.


COMMUNION LITURGY

It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks and praise to you, almighty and merciful God, through our Savior Jesus Christ. And so, with all the choirs of angels, with the church on earth, the hosts of heaven and all creation, we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

Illuminating God, source of creation, our salvation and our hope, we praise you for your creative labor, bearing expectations for life and love. When we strayed from your path and chose cruelty and despair, you spoke to us through unexpected prophets: Isaiah envisioned a blossoming desert; Mary proclaimed a world turned upside down; John the Baptist cried out for repentance. 
INVITATION TO COMMUNION

The assembly is seated.


LAMB OF GOD (to the tune of Cradle Song)


