#### From the Pastor

Life Stewardship

Life Stewardship is the state we live in when we come to the understanding that everything we are, everything we have, basically everything is given by God. Every second we live, we are engaged in receiving gifts from God. Whether it be our food, clothing, the air we breathe, our employment, our family, friends, neighbors, freedoms, and every blessing or curse in our life...it is in our life for a reason and as a gift.

Sometimes finances and blessings can seem lacking. It can be difficult to see where there will be anything left to give. But, there are some very good and proven promises that God has given to us...especially during those bleak times.

Malachi 3 says, "Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the LORD Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that you will not have room enough for it." This is the ONLY place in the Bible where God says, "test me". God does this because the challenge is not simply financial, it's a challenge of the heart.

In Luke 12:34, Jesus says, "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also". When your heart is set on God, the word treasure takes on a whole new meaning. It's not simply material things, it's grounded in the eternal places from which all things come – God. In 2nd Corinthians 9:7, Paul says, "God loves a cheerful giver." Thank you for sharing your gifts, and remember - "God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work" (2 Corinthians 9:8). Praise be to God in Christ Jesus!

The congregational vitality survey some of you filled out has been compiled and by the time you read this, we will have had a debrief on what it showed. That will initiate plans by the council to take specific actions to take advantage of the strengths and to try to overcome whatever shortcomings we might have. In addition very soon the pastors and council presidents will be meeting to talk over the situation with North County ELCA churches, where we are or where we aren't, and how we can best work together to create and maintain strong relationships with each other and our communities. I look to all of you to provide the support we will need to make it happen and be the success that will last a long time into the future.

In addition, we will be kicking off our stewardship campaign in July, with pledges being due the first part of August. All of you know that our recent financial trend has NOT been positive. Thanks to a generous gift we recently received, we have a little more time to make the things mentioned above happen. That will be a marathon, not a sprint, so we need time. I ask all of you to do the best you can to provide financial support for this church and our direction for the future. We are NOT in financial difficulty now, but the trend of being between \$3000 and \$4000 in the hole every month has to be reversed. With time, the efforts mentioned above are potential solutions to the problem, but again, with time. In the meantime, we absolutely need all of you to step up and do what you can. That may mean incurring some compromises in other areas of your life, but just where does God and your faith rate on your priority list? Talk it over at home and give it very serious consideration. I wish financial issues had nothing to do with our spiritual mission here. but it does and the ways around it are NOT necessarily very attractive. I apologize for harping on this, but it is critical to our success. I hope you agree and will support us in August at pledge time. And please do pledge whatever the amount might be. It helps us plan for next year. I appreciate it and we will all look for God's help and guidance in the process.

#### July Nurse's Note by Cathie Lehr MSN, RN

#### **FALL PREVENTION**

#### 25 Percent of the elderly will fall each year

Certain aging-related factors contribute to the risk of falls in older people:

- Health Conditions
- Medication Side Effects
- Vision Problems
- Balance and Gait Issues
- Environment
- Attempting To Do Things Beyond Their Ability
- Dementia

There are many consequences that may happen when an elderly person falls. Most injuries are the result of weak muscles, brittle bones, and fragile joints.

Hips and wrists are the most common broken bones in the elderly.

#### Some ways elders can prevent falls:

- Be aware of medication side effects and environmental hazards
- Make sure clothing and shoes fit properly and are non-slip.
- Get rid of clutter and tripping hazards in the home
- Use safety devices such as canes, walkers, grab bars, raised toilet seats, and transfer benches
- Make sure there is plenty of light and install night lights if needed
- Be alert when small animals are present
- Seniors can build muscle strength through a gentle exercise program such as chair yoga or tai chi
- Getting regular check-ups with medical care provider and eye doctor

#### A fall can be a shock to the body as well as emotional and disorienting

Other than visually obvious signs of severe injuries after a fall, there are several ways to raise cause for concern

#### Symptoms to observe after a fall:

- Do not attempt to move them. Ask them not to move until you are sure they are n serious injuries' Check to find out if they are able to speak. They may be able to tell you if they are hurting in a specific area
- If they can't speak, you must get them emergency help right away. Call 911 immediately.
- Look for broken bones, or possible fractures and sprains. Major bruising can be a clue for a reason to visit the emergency room.
- If the person is able to get up on their own safely, monitor them closely for increased confusion, or an impaired gait.
- If the senior complains of dizziness, vomiting, or serious headache, do not let them go to sleep or lay down, call 911 immediately. Additionally, changes in behavior after hitting their head may be cause for concern.

#### **Additional Safety Interventions:**

- Set up a family or friend wellness check system
- Consistently encourage and insist it is perfectly acceptable for elderly to seek any assistance
- Encourage senior to carry cell phone at all times
- Consider purchase and use of a medical alert system device or fall detection device

Fifteen members and three guests enjoyed lunch and conversation at Bandanas on Thursday, June 8. A good time was had by all.


