Torch Bearer in Paris

It's Olympic season in Paris! All the athletes and teams from nations around the world converged on Paris. They were sorted onto boats and sailed down the River Seine in front of crowds of people cheering. There were all kinds of creative productions, stages with freestyle cyclists and skateboarders, dancers choreographed to riveting music, and dramatic adaptations of many historically known stories. The torch made its way being carried by several public figures from music, Olympians, and a mysteriously hooded figure. The city of lights was lit up, Eiffel Tower displayed an amazing array of lasers and other lights, and flags from many countries were flown in celebration. Efforts to foil the joy and excitement were made through attacks on the train system and even the rain drenched them all. But the show went on. Some participants covered in plastic, others embracing the elements, they all wouldn't have their spirits tarnished.

During the later parts of the parade the cameras focused in on a lone figure - a metal robotic horse and hooded rider, seemingly hovering over the river holding a torch! It was graceful, scary, exciting, mysterious, and otherworldly. As I watched, the camera zoomed out and panned to reveal what attendees were seeing. It was on a dark raft of some sort being pulled slowly through the river by a small watercraft.

There had to be some kind of trick to it! The illusion was really cool looking, but the full detail of it all brought my senses back to earth. The timing of this was almost perfect as I had just been preparing for the Sunday's Gospel text from John 6:1-21, where Jesus walks on water. Maybe someone planning this did it on purpose? Who knows...

Thinking of the disciples, exhausted and discouraged from rowing miles against the wind on rough waters, the water parade provided a sort of parallel. What if that Horse and rider wasn't on a raft being pulled? What if it were really hovering over the waters? It still wouldn't be as impressive as Jesus coming to them in the early morning hours, unexpected.

In a storm, after an amazing display of power, coming out from the darkness like a ghost on the water - Jesus found them. Not in front of a parade or part of an already exciting event, no cameras, lights, and no expressions of great human accomplishment. Just a crew of tired and sweaty disciples trying to get to Capernaum.

Parallel accounts in Matthew and Mark record something similar, with some nuances. Hoping to provide some kind of presentation, I searched and prayed. I wanted to say something that would feed my desire to see things in an exciting way, some expert pastoral perspective to inspire readers.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT Randy Henning

For those of you that don't know, the pack for FMSC at Atonement on July 13 was a big success. The concern was always whether we could ignite folks to support the effort again after failing to have a pack in 2023. Mission accomplished. Our 2025 pack is already being planned for the weekend of July 11-12. Fund raising will be a key issue for next year. So if you have skills in that area, the leadership team could use you to help with that. Contact me if you are interested or just want to join the team in some capacity. Our goals will be greater next year, so we need all the help we can get.

Just an update on our financial condition. We have a strategy team in place to look at the different alternatives to fixing that issue. We are working with a real estate person and are trying to find ways to minimize or help the problem. We have a couple of organizations that might want to lease space, but we really can't do much without having a lawyer to protect us contractually. So if you know a lawyer who could help with that, please let me know. Obviously, we don't have a lot of money to pay for one, so that would have to be a concern. But we are looking at all alternatives to mitigate our financial woes. Obviously, if you can afford to give more, that always helps. We will continue to find possible ways to keep the spirit and passion of LCLC alive and well, whatever form that eventually takes. God will lead us in our efforts.

The expenses for the month of June were \$14,840 and the income for the month was \$12,980. This month had expenses \$1,860 more than income. The year-to-date expenses of \$88,104 exceed year-to-date income of \$66,882 by \$21,222. For the first half of the year our deficit is now averaging just over \$3,500 per month, or about \$42,000 by the end of the year. We still have 6 months left this year to help make up the shortfall.


