We may not be able to see what is on the other side of this warm autumn, the current election season, or many other things. Be encouraged: whatever may happen to throw us off, make us wonder, or want to wither – God's word endures, remains, stands FOREVER!

So, remember this as we continue to celebrate the times we are together, the ways that God is blessing us, and the many more ways we will see God's word and work flourish and endure. We are born anew of imperishable seed!

PRESIDENT'S REPORT Randy Henning

I want to update you on where we are with listing the church property for sale and a couple of other things. First, Pastor and I have looked at the listing agreement and have found some things we question. By the time you read this, we will have met with the realtor again and worked out those issues. Our intent is to have an agreement in place by November I or very soon after. And in case you were wondering, there will be NO sign out front. The strategy team continues to meet and address our situation moving forward. Combining churches just to increase numbers will NOT have a permanent effect on the mission of the North County ELCA

churches. We need to work on methods to build our church and become a firmer foundation for

the gospel in North County.

The second thing is that we are actively starting to fund raise for next year's FMSC pack at Atonement on July 11-12. There will be four (4) shifts, one (1) on Friday and three (3) on Saturday. We need donations to make sure we can pay for it. If you would like to contribute, please make checks out to Feed My Starving Children and give them to me or leave them in my mailbox. We have a new fund raising idea that LCLC will participate in. It is called "Adopt a Pallet". We packed 18 pallets last year. That is 36 boxes of 216 meals each or a total of 7776 meals per pallet. That cost is about \$2300. I would like LCLC to pay for a pallet. In a couple of weeks, a poster will appear in the upper level somewhere very visible to keep track of how we are doing in reaching that goal. We have 8 months or so before the pack, so that is plenty of time to get it

done. Please understand, do NOT feed this fund at

the expense of what you normally give. These are

whatever you give to the general fund. Give your checks to me or put them in the collection plate. Put "Pallet Challenge" in the memo portion of the

check. That does it for now. Stay tuned

The expenses for the month of September were \$14,676 and the income for the month was \$11,167. The expenses for the month were \$3,509 greater than income. The year-to-date expenses of \$131,254 exceed year-to-date income of \$103,017 by \$28,238. Our monthly deficit is still averaging about \$3,100 per month.
