The Communicator

We all carry marks of our past. As we pass from one thing to the next, we retain memories, different behavioral traits, expressions, and/or scars and "triggers". During my seminary training I thought it would be appropriate to somehow commemorate major life-changing events by getting a new tattoo each time. So, I drew up a tattoo for my right shoulder.

The tattoo is a basic Christian fish shape with the Greek letters " $iX\Theta Y\Sigma$ ", or "IXTHUS", meaning: I – Jesus, X – Christ, Θ – God's, Y (or υ) – Son, Σ – Savior placed inside the fish. The "I" extends above the fish and forms a cross. This is that mark of my being of service to God. People would often remind me, "Just remember, tattoos aren't easily removed."

I am often reminded of this mark on my life and the thought of many other life-changing events. Tattoos remembering the calls into pastoral ministry at Trinity, Light of the Valley, Christ the Cornerstone, Unity, Peace, and Living Christ Lutheran Churches. Other imprints to remember my Grandpa Joe, Grandma Irene, Aunt Carole, and Stepmother Connie are also on the list for future visits to the ink shop. However, these other tattoos were never imprinted on me.

Realizing the cost of continued visits to the tattoo parlor, it didn't seem to be the top priority with other demands. Not to mention, they would probably be rarely openly visible very often in order to avoid any distractions or misconceptions. Yet, the permanence of these memories hasn't been lost. In fact, I still bear actual physical scars from life during those times (not of my choosing).

Through the scars I am reminded of unintended moments where attention was on something else, estimates weren't correct, or actions didn't match what was intended... either by me, or by another. We call these things "accidents" sometimes. As if there is no intentional, expected, deliberate, or predictable explanation or meaning to what caused the scars. At the same time, through these so-called accidents we also learn lessons, discover meaning, find commonality, and gain wisdom. What causes the scars and the presence of them contradicts the thought of them being accidents. In fact, they are of great value!

John writes in chapter 20, "*Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.*" The scars are a testament to the events we have experienced, not intended as a reminder of things we regret. So, the scars on the body or on the heart are there as imprints of something we survived. They are a witness that speaks for itself into the depths of our personalities, lessons learned, and wisdom gained.

Older American Month

In the United States, the month of May is dedicated to recognizing the contributions of older adults. highlighting aging trends, and reaffirming commitments to serving them in the community. "Flip the Script on Aging" is the theme presented for 2025 to draw attention to actions promoting recognition and opportunities for older adults to stay socially connected.

The Administration for Community Living (ACL) is a government agency participating in research and implementing changes to monitor and improve living needs for older adults and disabled people. ACL promotes a shift in how society views and interacts with older adults and those with disabilities and challenges negative stereotypes and misconceptions about aging and disability.

On the ACL web site, you can view information published that describes some of the common themes that are beginning to emerge from the experiences, insights, and recommendations to improve health and safety for older adults and disabled people. It includes input on factors that influence the aging experience, such as affordable and accessible housing; aligned health care and supportive services; accessible communities; age-friendly workplaces; and sufficient, high-quality long-term services and supports.

Here are some other ways you can participate:

- Share facts about the mental, physical, and emotional health benefits of social connection and how it contributes to overall well-being with older adults.
- Seek resources and encourage participation to help older adults engage in community events, social clubs, church functions, and volunteer opportunities.
- Connect older adults with local services such as transportation, that can help them
 overcome obstacles to achieving or maintaining meaningful relationships.
- Challenge professional and personal networks to prioritize meaningful social connections and share the benefits.
- Consult with physicians concerning a change in an older adult's interest and participation with socializing.


